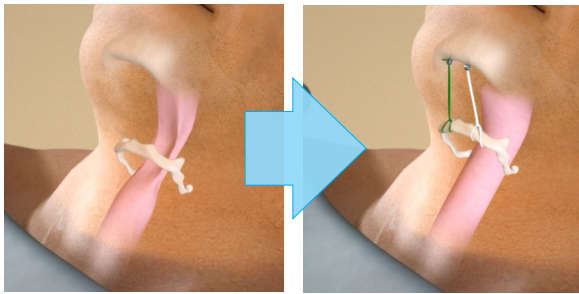

The AirLift® Procedure

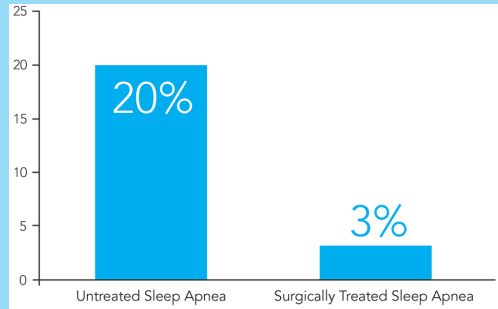
is a simple surgical procedure with few side effects. Sutures are first placed **around the hyoid bone** and then small suture anchors are secured **under the chin**. Your doctor then repositions the hyoid bone **forward** to open your airway. If necessary, your doctor may also place a **suture loop** to help prevent the tongue from blocking the airway.
